

Archaeological site of Dion

The archaeological site of Dion, located at the foothills of Mount Olympus, was the most important sanctuary of the ancient Macedonians, dedicated to Zeus and the Olympian gods. Castle of Platamon

Built in the early 13th century by the Franks during the Fourth Crusade, it served as a strategic stronghold to control the passage between Macedonia and Thessaly.
