Transfers from Split airport to Split city centre

All transfer options from Split airport to Split city centre can be found under the following links:

Uber or Bolt is available in the city and costs around 30–50 €. You must exit the building and cross the street; the pickup point is at the South parking lot. Alternatively,

you can go through the building – there is a bridge or tube that leads to the South parking lot.

Connecto transfers – the journey takes about 25 to 30 minutes to the city, the price for a car for 4 people is about 40 €.

With the **Pleso prijevoz bus**, the journey to the city takes about 30 to 40 minutes. The last stop is the main bus station in Split (autobusni kolodvor, close to Riva, the main promenade in the city center).

Note: They plan to change providers soon; however, another public option with similar conditions will be available.

Public buses no. 37 and 38 take about 50 minutes. However, I do not recommend them, as they are usually very crowded.

Taxi are available at the airport or by phone (+385 21 1777). The journey from Split airport to the city centre takes between 25 and 40 minutes. The cost is around €40 for 1 to 4 people. Public transport to Campus

The bus stop for line 15 is located on the southern edge of the bus station (autobusni kolodvor) and departs every half hour (timetable no. 15). A one-way ticket can be purchased on the bus for €2.00 or in the app for €1.00. Get off at the next stop (Tržnica – Pazar) and then wait across the street for bus no. 11 or no. 18. Your ticket is valid for 45 minutes as long as you continue traveling in the same direction. If you get off at the 5th stop (line 18) or the 6th stop (line 11), follow the map below. The walk is about 250 meters uphill.

Figure 2 Bus lines in Split

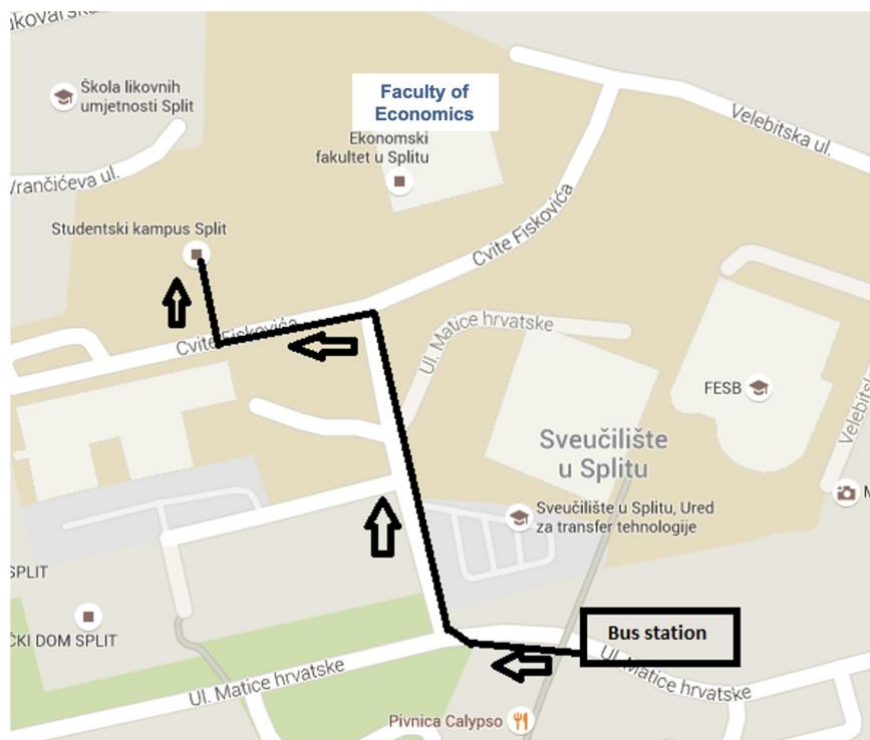

Bus station and Faculty of Economics, Business and Tourism (FEBT) location: It is more or less straightforward from the bus station, heading uphill.



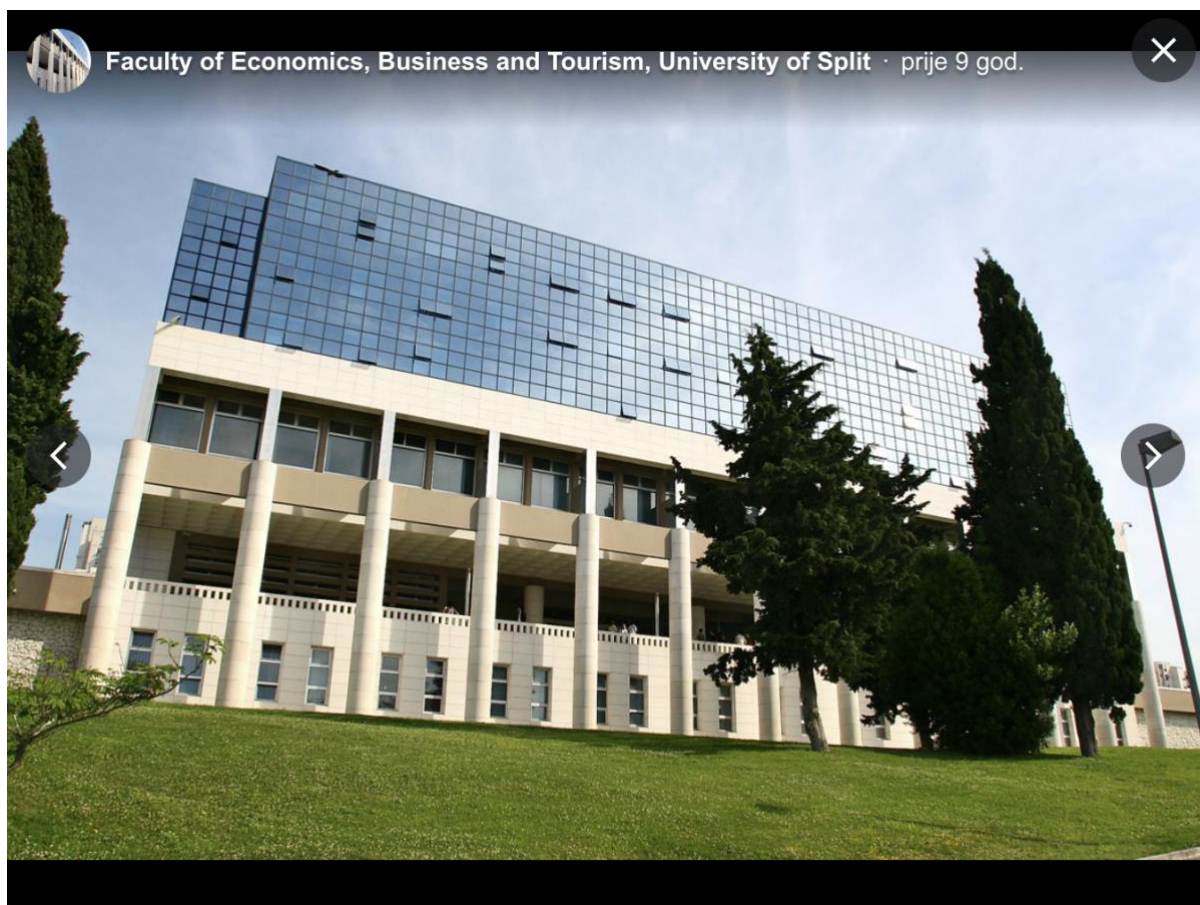

The city of Split

The history of Split spans 17 centuries, beginning when Roman Emperor Diocletian chose to build his palace on the peninsula near the great Roman city of Salona, where he intended to spend his final years. Over these 1,700 years, the palace gradually transformed into a city that continues to attract visitors with its rich tradition, illustrious history, and the beauty of its natural and cultural heritage.

Diocletian's Palace and the entire historical core of Split have been on the UNESCO World Heritage List since 1979, not only because of the palace's exceptional preservation but also because both the palace and the city remain vibrant and full of life. All the historical layers – from ancient Rome and the Middle Ages to the present day – are still visible and alive in this area. A walk through the ancient city takes you through time, past magnificent examples of ancient architecture such as the peristyle, the medieval Romanesque church, the Gothic palace, the Renaissance portals of noble houses, Baroque facades, and modern architecture that blend seamlessly with the rich heritage.

This layering is also evident in everyday life in Split. Locals frequent the same cafés, restaurants, and shops as tourists, giving visitors the sense that they have become part of the city and its rhythm upon arrival. The vegetable and fish markets are central to every family's life in Split, just as the city's entire social life is reflected on the Riva, where every guest should try to enjoy coffee alongside the lively and spirited residents of Split.

Split is much more than a magnificent architectural backdrop. It is also a destination for outstanding gourmet and wine experiences, numerous cultural events such as film and theater festivals, exhibitions, excellent museums, and concerts. The city offers diverse entertainment, from clubs and bars to street festivals and major events like the Ultra Europe Festival, which attracts up to 100,000 young people from around 100 countries each year. Split can also boast sporting achievements matched by only a few cities of similar size worldwide, as it is home to numerous Olympic medalists and other sports champions.

If you need a break from the city's bustle, visit Marjan, the hill that symbolizes the city, with its forests, jogging trails, climbing and cycling paths, recreational areas, and old churches where past citizens of Split sought spiritual peace. Unusual for a city of Split's size are the many beaches with exceptionally clean sea, from the well-known Bačvice to the secluded stone oases around Marjan.

Climate

Visiting Split in September offers summer weather (around 25-35°C), fewer tourists, and lower costs, making it great for exploring Diocletian's Palace and Marjan Hill, though expect some rain and chilly sea temperatures, perfect for sightseeing and enjoying cafe culture before the summer rush.

Languages

- Croatian is the official language.
- Many signs are also in English.
- Most adults understand English and Italian and can speak them at a reasonable level.
- Many other languages are spoken, but it is more difficult to find speakers. German, French, and Serbian are common.
- English menus are usually available in restaurants and cafés.
- The working language of the training school is English.
